Sam Trubridge is a scholar, producer, director, designer, and curator working in the performing arts. He is artistic director for the trans-disciplinary performance company The Playground NZ and founding director of The Performance Arcade: a festival of performance art on Wellington Waterfront that is attended by 60-90,000 people each year since 2011.

With a PhD and an 'A' rating in both 2012 and 2018 PBRF reviews, Trubridge's research is characterised by a robust creative practice and extensive scholarship. His PhD thesis *Pelagic States: beyond nomadic and oceanic practices* explored this pairing of practice and theory as a fluid, multi-disciplinary, and multi-modal approach that investigated mobile states, liquidity, and oceanic spaces in performance.

The quality and esteem for Trubridge's work is evidenced by high-profile invitations to present work and lead workshops internationally: from curated festivals at La MaMa (New York) to running one of 15 regional clusters for the Performance Studies International 'Fluid States' project in 2015. His leadership in performance-making and curation extends into publication, with guest editorship of Performance Research journal, and an associate editorship for the World Scenography book series. Within NZ he has directed and produced The Performance Arcade festival every year, leading this event to become a highly esteemed platform with citations, awards, praise from international guests, and reports submitted to NZ government leaders.

The impact of Trubridge's research also reaches beyond performance into the fields of science, sport, and government (as above). Together these wide-ranging outputs define a practice that he has coined as 'pelagic' - an oceanographic term that defines a space not limited by borders and territories: examining distinctions between solo work and collaboration; between practice and theory; between directing and producing; between design, fine arts, and theatre. The recognition of each individual output proves their value in the whole, verifying the overall purpose of the research and demonstrating its high peer esteem and value in NZ and internationally.

With The PlayGround NZ Sam has directed and designed *The Restaurant of Many Orders* at London's Sadler's Wells, Wellington's Te Whaea National Centre for Dance + Drama, and for a tour of three venues around Italy. In 2008 he collaborated with Professor Philippa Gander at Massey University's Sleep/Wake Research Centre to direct and design the award winning *Sleep/Wake* (Wellington, Auckland, and New York). In 2020 he completed a new work *Ecology in Fifths* – for presentation at Te Whaea National Centre for Dance + Drama, Hawkes Bay Arts Festival, and H Guthrie-Smith Centre in Tūira.

Sam's work has been published and exhibited in various international contexts, including the Prague Quadrennial and World Stage Design. He has presented work at festivals and venues in Europe, Australia, Asia, and the Americas. He has written articles on performance for various publications worldwide. He is currently the Oceanic editor for *World Scenography*, a survey of performance design from 1975-2020.

Sam has also been teaching arts and design practices for 20 years. Between 2005-2009 Sam coordinated Massey University's cutting edge Performance Design Degree with Toi Whakaari, NZ Drama School. He was then employed as a lecturer in Spatial Design for the college of Creative Arts, Massey University. He has also taught at Victoria University Wellington, RMIT Melbourne, and delivered guest lectures at La Salle Singapore, University of Alabama Tuscaloosa, Victoria University, and AUT Auckland. He is currently a Senior Design Tutor at Toi Whakaari NZ Drama School.
